Actions taken at this Meeting do not constitute final Board action and are only Committee recommendations to be considered by the Board at the next Regular Board meeting.

III Adjournment to closed or executive session pursuant to Texas Government Code Sections 551.071; 551.072 and 551.074, the Open Meetings Act, for the following purposes:

A. Legal Matters

Consultation with legal counsel concerning pending or contemplated litigation, a settlement offer, or matters on which the attorney's duty to the System under the Texas Disciplinary Rules of Professional Conduct clearly conflicts with the Texas Open Meetings Laws.

B. Personnel Matters

Deliberate the appointment, employment, evaluation, reassignment, duties, discipline or dismissal of a public officer, employee or board member to hear complaints or changes against an officer, employee or board member unless the officer, employee or board member who is the subject of the deliberation or hearing requests a public hearing.

C. Real Estate Matters

Deliberate the purchase, exchange, lease, or value of real property for Agenda items if deliberation in an open meeting would have a detrimental effect on the position of the System in negotiations with a third person.

IV. Additional Closed or Executive Session Authority:

If, during the course of the meeting covered by this Notice, the Board should determine that a closed or executive meeting or session of the Board should be held

or is required in relation to any items included in this Notice, then such closed or executive meeting or session as authorized by Section 551.001 et seq. of the Texas Government Code (the Open Meetings Act) will be held by the Board at that date, hour and place given in this Notice or as soon after the commencement of the meeting covered by the Notice as the Board may conveniently meet in such closed or executive meeting or session concerning:

Section 551.071 - For the purpose of a private consultation with the Board's attorney about pending or contemplated litigation, a settlement offer, or matters on which the attorney's duty to the System under the Texas Disciplinary Rules of Professional Conduct clearly conflicts with the Texas Open Meetings Laws.

Section 551.072 - For the purpose of discussing the purchase, exchange, lease or value of real property if deliberation in an open meeting would have a detrimental effect on the position of the governmental body in negotiations with a third person.

Section 551.073 - For the purpose of considering a negotiated contract for a prospective gift or donation to the System if deliberation in an open meeting would have a detrimental effect on the position of the System in negotiations with a third person.

Section 551.074 - For the purpose of considering the appointment, employment, evaluation, reassignment, duties, discipline or dismissal of a public officer, employee or board member to hear complaints or changes against an officer, employee or board member unless the officer, employee or board member who is the subject of the deliberation or hearing requests a public hearing.

Section 551.076 - To consider the deployment, or specific occasions for implementation of security personnel or devices, or a security audit.

Section 551.082 - For the purpose of considering discipline of a student or to hear a complaint by an employee against another employee if the complaint or charge directly results in a need for a hearing, unless an open hearing is requested in writing by a parent or guardian of the student or by the employee against whom the complaint is brought.

Section 551.084 - For the purpose of excluding a witness or witnesses in an investigation from a hearing during examination of another witness in the investigation. Should any final action, final decision, or final vote be required in the opinion of the Board with regard to any matter considered in such closed or executive meeting or session, then such final action, final decision, or final vote shall be at either:

A. The open meeting covered by this Notice upon the reconvening of the public meeting, or

B. At a subsequent public meeting of the Board upon notice thereof, as the Board shall determine.

COMPELLING REASON AND BACKGROUND

This report item highlights key considerations associated with the now interim session period that leads to the upcoming 90th Texas legislative session in 2027. It addresses in part interim charges that routinely help identify and shape policy development before a legislative session begins, allowing for policy planning and strategic engagement. The report also provides an update on the *Strengthening Community Colleges Training grants*, emerging from the Department of Labor.

The above-identified discussion matters serve the purpose of apprising the HCC governing board on and about state and federal considerations deemed important to the institution.

Introduction

Executive Summary

This work principally concerns interim charges issued by the Texas Speaker of the House and the Lieutenant Governor.

Interim charges inform state agencies, including higher education institutions, about policy considerations deemed important to the Texas Legislature in anticipation of the next legislative session.

Effectively, interim charges also help guide interested parties in the development of a policy agenda, which is the work before the College.

This item also addresses *Strengthening Community College Training Grants*, a federal program.

Key Considerations

- Understand priorities of state leadership and identify synergies to maximize opportunity
- Collaboratively devise a proposed legislative agenda for governing board review and adoption
- Identify status of Department of Labor grant program benefitting community colleges

Key House Interim Charges

- Monitor and oversee implementation of appropriations bills (*Appropriations*)
- Infrastructure, Technology, and Workforce for Economic Development (*Appropriations*)
- Monitor the implementation of legislation passed by the 89th Legislature, including SB 1786 (cleanup bill for HB 8 88R) (*Higher Education*)
- Evaluate methods to increase credential completion aligned with regional labor demands; explore impact of Workforce Pell (*Higher Education*)
- Review healthcare workforce shortage (*Public Health*)
- Study workforce development and labor market conditions in Texas, including skills gaps (*Subcommittee on Workforce*)
- Study and consider methods to build on property tax relief; review cost and benefits (*Ways and Means*)
- Study shortages in aviation workforce and explore opportunity to work with community colleges and others to develop pathways (*General Aviation, Select*)



Key Senate Interim Charges

- Homestead Exemption from 65 to 55 years of age (*Finance*)
- Preparing Texas Workforce for AI – enhance resiliency, align education pathways with employer needs (*Economic Development Committee*)
- Examine financial reporting and disclosure practices of public higher education institutions and make recommendations (*Finance*)
- Review implementation of community college funding model and make recommendations for structural changes (*Higher Education*)
- Monitor implementation of SB 37 (governance) and other legislation passed in 89th Legislature (*Higher Education*)
- Examine and make recommendations to cut Texans' property taxes (*Local Government Committee*)
- Examine effect of increasing homestead exemptions (*Local Government Committee*)



Proposed Association* Strategic Priorities

- **Formula Funding and Outcomes** – evaluate the implementation of SB 1786 (89R); devote attention to wage thresholds, ROI,** and data used in the definition of Credentials of Value (COV)
- **Dual Credit Incentives & Pathways** – evaluate state’s current funding methodologies; recommend strategies that strengthen connection between COV and dual credit programs
- **Workforce Education Grants and Tri-Agency Coordination** – strengthen workforce and evaluate targeted investments in aligning education and training programs with high-demand jobs and regional labor market needs

**Return on Investment

Emerging HCC Policy Considerations

- Ensure the biennial budget (FY28-29) maintains growth, including maximizing outcomes-based funding
- Optimize student aid opportunities, including grants
- Inform implementation of Workforce Pell
- Inform consequential tax legislation
- Promote proficiencies in compliance reporting that provides better data, while minimizing undue burden
- Elevate HCC Artificial Intelligence initiative
- Improve workforce education programming
- Strengthen alignments between COV and dual credit programs



Next Steps

- Assess interim charges with subject matter experts
- Participate in interim hearings to gain information and insights
- Prioritize and refine proposed initiatives
- Present draft for executive review, discussion, direction and/or approval
- Seek governing board input and agenda adoption
- Publish adopted HCC legislative agenda

Rationale: Optimize opportunity to successfully adopt and advance an HCC policy agenda in anticipation of the 90th legislative session

Federal Relations

Strengthening Community College Training Grants

- DOL* issued on February 17, 2026
- Grant operates to scale statewide high-quality short-term training programs under Workforce Pell
- Eligible applicants include public and state-controlled institutions of higher education
- Project awards will range between \$6.5 million and \$10.8 million
- Application deadline May 20, 2026
- HCC is a participating institution

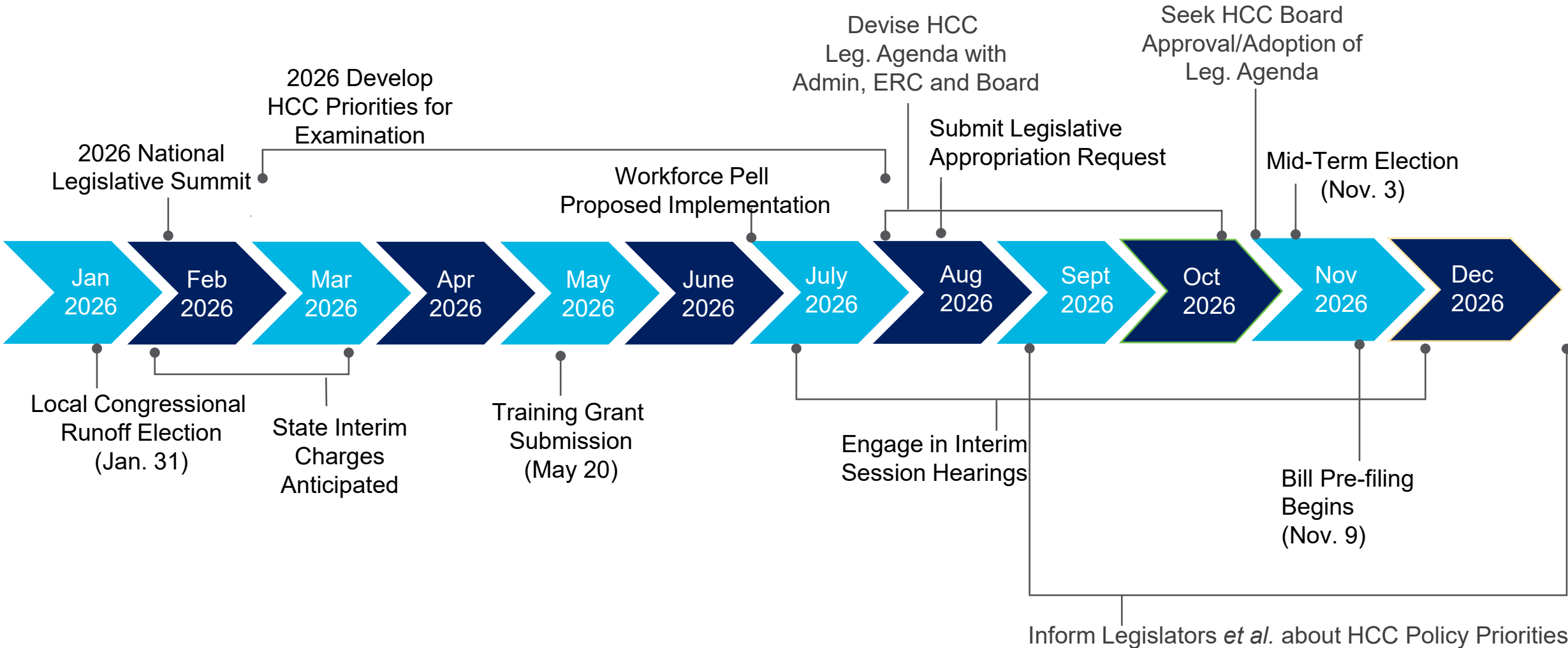
Key Requirements

- Applicants must apply as a consortium
- Consortia must include at least 50% of the state's community colleges - 33 colleges responded
- Lead applicant must be a community college
- Projects must be supported at the state level to include consideration by the Governor's office

Note: Only one project per state may be funded
